

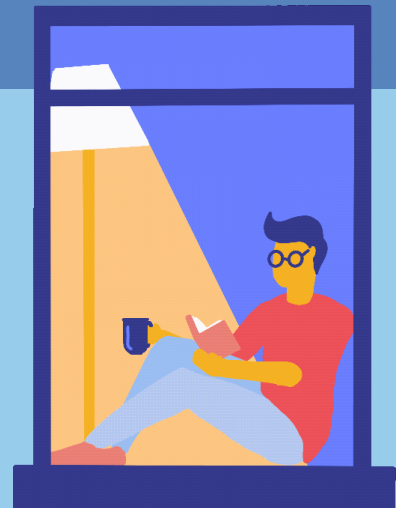
TIPS AND TRICKS TO SAVE MONEY

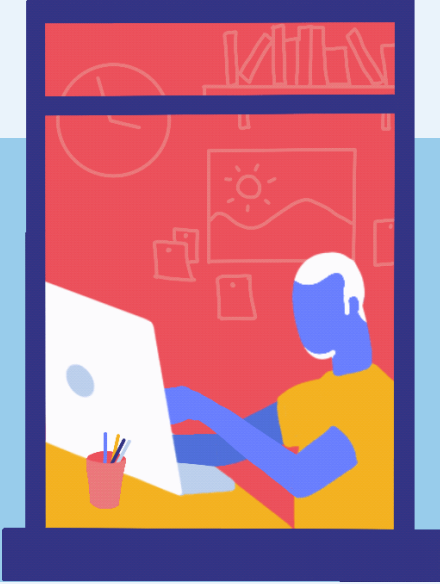
WHARTON COMPUTING
